Ion, and under him by Monsieur de Louvigny.

Himburg; July 2. The fuccess of the Danes and Durch fileet, feems to quicken the Confederates in their design upon Stade, who are now advancing nearer to the place; have fent for their Cannon for Battery to be brought into their Camp and as is fald, will without and faithet delay begin the Siege. The Sieur B fliadnz who came into the Elbe with 7 Dutch Men of War, is terning home again with hem, xcept two, which are gone with the Sicu Eve for towards the Sounds. The Elector of Brandenburg is now certainly on his march,

3 Dan. B Regiments having joined him.

Bruffels, Fuly 7. On Sagurday the 4th instant, very early in the morning, the Prince of Orange parted from the Camp at Nivelle with a Body of 6000 Men. On Sun lay his Highness lodged with them in the Neighborhoud of Tillemont, and yesterday at Tongres, and this af ternoon intended to investmaestricht, in order to a fiege. The Troops that are to be employed in it, viz. those of Ofnabrug, of Newburg, and those of the states, have for fome dives past been on their march, and will in all make up a Rody of 20000 Foor, and 6000 Horfe. By our next, we hope to tell you, that the Siege is actually formed; the Garison in the place, is said to consist in 5000 Foot, and 1500 Horse. From Namur we feceive Letters this afternoon, which fay, That yesterday a Bridge of Boats was sent from thence, with fix pieces of Cannon for Battery towards Maestricht, the Bridge is for the making the Communication between this and the other fide of the Meuse towards Liege, while another Bridge will be brought down from Ruremonde, for the making the Communication on the fide of Majeroke. The Dutch and spanish Army continues in the mean time at Nivelle, the Dutch Troops being commanded under the Duke de Villa Hermoft, who, in the absence of the Prince of Orange, is Generalissimo, by the Prince of Frizeland with the Title of Lieutenant-General, and by Count Waldecke. On Saturday last, the Most Christian King left his Army, and is returned with the Troops of his Houshold towards Paris; his Army temains at Kicurain, (having only passed to the other side of the small River of that name) under the command of the Mareschal de Schomberg. Valenciennes and Cambray continue very much straitned by the French Troops that are posted round those places.

Hague, July 7. The great discourse at present here, is con cerning the Siege of Macferiths, which, according to the mea fures his Highness had taken, was to be invested this evening The Troops of Ofnab ug, under the command of Monfieur de Louviguy, are in order to this Siege coming down, from Colegne; those of Newburg, commanded by Count S. bellard, march from Guederland, where bey have layn some time, and the Sieur Kel-farrick having drawn a Body of 5 or 6000 Foot out of Boldney and the Neighbouring Garisons, has for some dayes past been likewile pa his march towards Machricks, to which Troops the Prince adds 5000 which he brought with him from his Army, and these together will make up an Army of 20000 Foot, and 7 or 8000 Horse. From Humon g they write, That the confederates feen, new in good carnett to intend the Siege of Stade, where, we are assured, the Inhabitants as well as soldiers have great Eageity of Progision.

Pa is, 7 sty 8. This evening the King is expected at Verfailles, having been Treated latt night by the Prince of Ma fit ac at Linnous, where his Majetty lodged, with intention to dine this day with the Prince of conde at Chantaly. We are told that the Prince of Corde will in few dayes begin his journy towards
Flanders; being to command the Army there, which his Majesty lefe in the mean time under the con uct of the Mareschal de Schunbergi. We have Letters from St asburg of the 2d inftant, which inform us, That the Duke of Lux mburg continued encamped in that Neighborhood, having very much destroyed the Countrey thereabouts. Our Fleet of Men of War is at prefent at Thoulon, but will very fuddenly return again to Mef-

Stochton, June 27.
