

and Merchandises before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majesty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers, from on Board the same, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners, and other Officers of His Majesty's Customs, do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine, before directed, be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War, as likewise the Commanders of His Majesty's Forts and Garrisons, lying near the Sea Coasts, and all the Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tything Men, and all other Officers and Ministers of Justice, be aiding and assisting to the said Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforesaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the said respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty hath received Information, that a contagious Distemper rages among the horned Cattle upon the Coast of France; His Majesty doth thereupon, with the Advice of His Privy Council, find it Necessary to Order, and doth hereby accordingly Order and Command, that no horned Cattle, nor any Manner of Hides, Skins, Horns, Hoofs or other Part of any horned Cattle or Beast, nor any Hay, Straw, Litter, Fodder, or other Things, which have been employed about infected Cattle, or the Hides or any other Part of such Cattle, or have been in or near the Places where any such Infection hath been, and are liable to retain the same, shall be Imported from any Ports or other Places on the Coast of France, within the Districts of Picardie, Normandie and Bretagne, into the Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Islands or Dominions thereto belonging; and His Majesty doth farther, with the Advice of His Privy Council, strictly Charge and Command, all Magistrates, Constables, Officers of the Customs and Excise, to stop, seize and destroy, the several Things so prohibited as aforesaid, using and exercising in that Behalf, the like Authority as any Officer or Officers have, by any Law now in being, in Cases of prohibited and uncustomed Goods. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lord Lieutenant of His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Stockholm, Sept. 14. The King of Sweden proposes to go next Tuesday to Linköping, in order to review the Regiment of Ostrogothia, assembled for the Purpose near that Town; during which Time the Queen, with Prince Henry of Prussia, will make a Tour to Upsal; and on their Return his Royal Highness will embark for Abo, and from thence pursue his Journey, by Land, to Petersburg.

Florence, Sept. 22. We are informed, that on the 10th Instant, a Consistory was held at Rome, in which the following Persons were created Cardinals, viz. M. Scipio Borghese, Grand Chamberlain; M. John Baptist Rezzonico Maggiordomo, and the Promotion of M. Mario Marfoschi, Secretary of Propaganda Fide, to that Dignity ever since the 29th of January last, (which had been reserved in peccore) was announced to the College of Cardinals. Cardinal Rezzonico is to continue in the Charge of Maggiordomo till farther Orders.

Turin, Sept. 22. His Sardinian Majesty and the rest of the Royal Family go To-morrow to Stupiniggi for a Week, to take the Diversion of Stag-hunting.
