HESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable my Lords and others, Commissioners for the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chessea, to give Notice, that all Out-Pensioners (as well Letter-Men as others) belonging to the said Hospital, residing in London, or within Twenty-sive Miles thereof, are required to appear Personally at the Secretary Office in the said Hospital; and are required also to appear Regimentally, on the respective Days appointed for them, as are hereafter men loned, when Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning 'till Three in the Asternoon, in order to register their Appearances, viz.

Monday January 7, 1771.

The Penfioners from the 1st and 2d, and late 3d and 4th Troops of Horse Guards; 1st and 2d Troops of Horse Grenadier Guards; Royal Regiment of Horse Guards Blue; 3d, 4th, and 7th Regiments of Horse, Lettermen, and Men at 9d, per Diem.

Tuesday January 8.

The Pensioners from the 1st, 2d, and 3d Regiments of Dragoon Guards; and all the Dragoons.

Wednesday January 9.

Those from the 1st Regiment of Foot Guards.

Thursday January 10.
Those from the 2d Regiment of Foot Guards.

Friday January 11.
Those from the 3d Regiment of Foot Guards.

Saturday January 12.

Those from the 1st to the 12th Regiment of Foot, inclusive:

Monday January 14.

Those from the 13th to the 24th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Tuesday January 15.
Those from the 25th to the 40th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Wednesday January 16.
Those from the 42d to the 70th Regiment of Foot, inclusive.

Thursday January 17.

Those from the late 7 th to the 119th Regiment of Foot inclusive, as also the Pensioners from the former Broken Regiments of Foot, and Marines, Independent Companies, and such as have been In-Pensioners in Chilica Hospital.

And that all Out-Penfioners (as well Lettermen as others) belonging to the faid Hospital, who live at a greater Distance than 25 Miles from London, and those in Scotland and Ireland, are hereby required and commanded, that, after the 25th of December, and after every succeeding 25th of June and December, till further Orders, they forthwith apply themselves to one of His Majetty's Justices of the Peace, in the Neighbourhood where they reside Magittrate for the County, City, Borough, or Riding, before whom the Pensioner appears, will sign and date, viz.

To the End that the Commilioners for the Affairs of the faid Hospital may be satisfied, that they are the same Persons who have passed their Examinations, the Pensioners are hereby further directed, that such of them as have served in, and been sucharged from, any of the Regiments or Independent Companies of Invalids, are not to mention in their Affidavits, such Regiment or Company of Invalids, in which they served, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged, and recommended and received to Chessea Hopital.

The Affidavit drawn according to the above Form, fworn before, dated and attested by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent by the General Post (directed thus:) To the Right Hunourable the Paymaster General at the Horse Guard, London; and Counterparts or Duplicates of the taid Affidavits are to be reserved by the Out Pensioners respectively, to be exhibited to such Persons as shall be directed to pay them; that they may be fatisfied that all such as may claim Out Pensions, are the real Persons intitled to receive the same.

And as the General Payments in Great Britain and Ireland, at the End of the enfuing Six Months, are chiefly regulated by the Places of Rendence mentioned by the Penfioners who are multered at Chelfea in Person, and in the Body of the Affidavits of such who live at a Distance; it is hereby ordered and directed, that no Pensioner, who shall change the Place of his Abode given at his Muster, or specified in his Affidavit aforesaid, and who may apply for his Pension, except to the Officers of Excise nearest such Place of Abode, shall receive the same, unless it appear, by the Certificates of respectable Persons, that such Removal was through some unavoidable Necessity, which he or they could not foresee or prevent.

Lailly, it is not fied, that none will be entered upon the Pay Litts of the faid Hospital, or be thought intitled to receive any Benefit therefrom who shall not act agreeable to these Orders and Directions.
