December, 1770, PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of October latt, to promise and declare, amongst other Things, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds for every Ordinary Scaman, should be paid to every fuch Seaman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of November last, volunt: ly enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Ro; al Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for very A le, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordin vy beaman, thould also be paid to any Person, who should, on or before the said Thirtieth Day of Novembe 'aft, discover any Seaman or Seamen who should et cal themselves, so that such Seaman or Sear on faculd be taken for His Majesty's faid Service: The Time for the Payment of which Bounties and Remards was afterwards prolonged to the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December. And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by another Proclamation, bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of November last, to promite and declare, that a Bounty of Twenty Shillings should be paid to each Able-Bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty, who should, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant December, voluntarily enter themselves to serve on Board His Majesty's Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation. And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid respective Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid feveral Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant December, to the Francearth Day of February next, inclusive. Whereof all Pur ons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.
