

WHEREAS His present Majesty, by His Letters Patent, bearing Date at Westminster the 28th Day of November 1770, hath granted unto me John Richter, of Newport-Street in the Parish of St. Ann Soho in the County of Middlesex, Scagoliolli, my Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, His special Licences, full Power, sole Privilege, and Authority to use, exercise, and vend the Art or Method of Inlaying Scagoliola or Plaster in and upon Marble and Metals, to imitate Flowers, Trees, Fruits, Birds, Beasts, Landscapes, and all Sorts of Ornaments, for the Term of Fourteen Years, within that Part of Great-Britain called England, the Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed; Now I the said John Richter do hereby give Notice, that if any Person or Persons whatsoever or whomsoever, within that Part of Great-Britain called England, the Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, shall at any Time or Times hereafter, during the said Term of Fourteen Years, in and by the said Letters Patent granted, either directly or indirectly do make Use of or put in Practice the said Invention, or any Part of the same, or in anywise counterfeit, imitate, or resemble the same, or shall make, or cause to be made, any Addition thereunto, or Subtraction from the same, without my Licence or Consent in Writing, under my Hand and Seal, first had and obtained in that Behalf, that I will prosecute all and every such Person and Persons so offending with the utmost Rigour of the Law.
