HIS Day being kept as the Anniverfary of Her Majefty's Birth Day, there was a very numerous and fplendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Perions of Diffinction, to compliment Their Majefties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock : There was a Bail at Court in the Evening; and Illuminations and other publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS this Majerly was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of October lait, to promife and declare, amongft other Things, that the Boun-ties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid to every fuch Seaman refpectively, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of November last, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Or-dinary Seaman, should also be paid to any Person, who should, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of November laft, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who should conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service: The Time for the Payment of which Bounties and Rewards was afterwards prolonged to the Thirty-first Day of this Inflant December. And whereas His Majefty was likewife pleafed, by another Proclamation, bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of November laft, to promise and declare, that a Bounty of Twenty Shillings thould be paid to each Able-Bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty, who should, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this lastant December, voluntarily enter themselves to ferve on floard His Mojer,'s Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation. And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid respective Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame fhould be continued for fome longer Time; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Conncil, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid feveral Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant December, to the Fourteenth Day of February next, inclusive. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
