And on the 30th, the College of Senators, together with a great Number of the Nobility, attended the Ceremony of the Funeral; du i 13 which Minute Guns were fired from the Fortiscations round the Mole; and the Galleys fired each Three Rounds, as did Two Companies of Soldiers, drawn up before the Ducal Palace. The fame Night the Corpfe was carried privately to a Church of the Franciscan Fryars, called the Lady of the Mount, Three Miles ditlant from the City, and deposited with the Ancestors of the Family Negrone.

Yesterday the Great Council met as usual, and named Fifteen Persons properly qualified to fill the va-

cant Dignity.
