AT the Court at St. James's, the 1st Day of March, 1771,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council:

THIS Day the Right Honourable George Earl of Pomfret was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint James Cecil, commonly called Lord Viscount Cranburn, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Hertford, he this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Whitehall, March 2.

The King having been pleased to grant His Royal Licence to Robert Melvill, Esq; Captain-General and Governor in Chief of His Majesty's Islands of Grenada, the Grenadines, St Vincent, and Tobago, in America, to return to this Kingdom; His Majesty has been pleased to appoint William Leybourne Leybourne, Esq; to be Captain-General and Governor in Chief of those Islands, in the room of the said Robert Melvill, Esq;

Stockholm, February 12. Our late Sovereign the King of Sweden, Adolphus Frederick, expired suddenly, about Eight o'Clock this Evening, at his Palace in this City, in the 61st Year of his Age, and 20th of his Reign.

Stockholm, February 12. Count Eric Sparre is made President of the College of Admiralty at Carlscrona, in the Room of his Brother, who died about two Months ago.

Genoa, February 2. The late Doge, Monsieur John Baptist Negroni, who died the 26th of last Month, lay in State in one of the Rooms of the Palace. On the 29th, at Night, the Corpse of the Deceased, in his Ducal Robes, was carried from thence privately to the Cathedral Church, and placed on a Pyramical Scaffold, Fifty-four Palms high. The Church was hung with Black. And on the 30th, the College of Senators, together with a great Number of the Nobility, attended the Ceremony of the Funeral; during which Minute Guns were fired from the Fortifications round the Mole; and the Gallies fired each Three Rounds, as did Two Companies of Soldiers, drawn up before the Ducal Palace. The same Night the Corpse was carried privately to a Church of the Franciscan Fryars, called the Lady of the Mount, Three Miles distant from the City, and deposited with the Ancestors of the Family Negroni.

Yesterday the Great Council met as usual, and named Fifteen Persons properly qualified to fill the vacant Dignity.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that a Dutch Ship, called the *Koopman*, Lodewyk Verwer Master, was, on the 12th Day of January last past, stranded near the Castle of Deal in the County of Kent; and that the said Ship was robbed, plundered, and at length totally destroyed, by a great Number of People, to the Amount of Four or Five Hundred, who carried off the Remains of the Wreck and Cargo on Horses, and in Waggon, to Deal, notwithstanding the Efforts of the Crew to prevent them: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Principal Offenders in an Outrage so subversive of Justice and Humanity, and so ignominious to this Country, and to prevent the like atrocious Practices for the future; is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon, and likewise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to any one of them, who shall discover the Rest, or any Two or more of the said Principal Offenders in the said atrocious Acts above-mentioned, so that they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof; and also the same Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person, not an Accomplice in the said wicked Crimes, who shall discover those principally concerned therein, so that they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid; the said Reward, in either Case, to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction of any one or more of the said Principal Offenders.
