**O**N the 28th past an Ediſt was published here, by which the Great Duke exempts from all Duty Foreign Corn imported into Tuscany, either by Sea or Land.

Berlin, March 23. Letters from Warsaw of the 13th Instant, contain the agreeable News, that the Plague had entirely ceased in those Parts of Poland, where it raged with the greatest Violence, and that now there were only some faint Remains of it at Mohilow upon the Dnieper.

On the 18th Instant his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Prussia set out from hence for Potsdam, where his Prussian Majesty continues in perfect Health.
