*Copenhagen, March 30.* The Passage of the Belt  
 continues so much encumbered with Ice, that the  
 Packet Boats come over with great Difficulty, and  
 not without some Danger. We had two Ham-  
 burgh Mails this Mornng; there is one still due  
 from thence, and three from England.

The Frost has continued longer and with greater  
 Severity this Year than usual; the fatal Effects of  
 it are sensibly felt by the Poor, and will soon be  
 so by all Ranks of People; the small Quantity of  
 Grain there is in this Capital, or indeed in any  
 Part of the Island, and the Impracticability of  
 importing any as yet, has raised Wheat to the  
 enormous Price of Seven Rix-dollars the Ton,  
 and Rye to Six; other Provisions bear a Propor-  
 tion to this, and have done so for some Months  
 past.

*Brussels, April 2.* On Saturday last, late in the  
 Evening, the King of Sweden, and his Brother  
 Prince Frederick, arrived here. The next Morning  
 early they set out for Antwerp, to view the City and  
 Paintings; and upon their Return on Monday, they  
 supped with the Minister Prince de Stahremberg,  
 where his Royal Highness Prince Charles and all  
 the Nobility and Foreign Ministers met them: As  
 they travel under the Titles of the Counts of Goth-  
 land and Eulang, all Etiquette was avoided.

*Hamburg, April 5.* The Senate of this City  
 have named Syndic Sillem, and Senator Widow,  
 to be their Deputies to go to Stralfund, to com-  
 pliment his Swedish Majesty on his Accession.
