SOME of the principal Merchants here have obtained Leave to erect Warehouses for the depositing of all Goods and Merchandize brought hither for Re-exportation; those imported in Foreign Ships paying One per Cent. Recognition, those in Danish Ships One and One half per Cent. are to be free of all other Duties.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that a Number of lawless Villains, at present unknown, on Tuesday the 16th Instant, between the Hours of Four and Five in the Afternoon, met Daniel Clark, in the Streets, and stript him, tied his Hands behind him, took him to a Pond, threw him in, and then threw Stones and Brickbats at him for some Time; then took him out, tied a Cord round his Neck, and threw him in the Pond again, and then threw Stones and Brickbats at him till they beat out his Brains: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person concerned in so cruel and inhuman a Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the said Number, (except the Person or Persons who had an immediate Hand in stripping the said Daniel Clark, tying his Hands behind him, taking him to the Pond, throwing him in, tying the Cord round his Neck, and throwing Stones and Brickbats at him) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
