*The Queen's Palace, St. James's Park,
June 5, 1771.*

THIS Morning, about Six o'Clock, the Queen was happily delivered of a Prince. Her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, several Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bedchamber, were present.

This great Event was soon after made known by the Firing of the Tower Guns.

Her Majesty is, God be praised, as well as can be expected; and the Young Prince is in perfect Health.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Lord Digby to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Dorset, and of the Town of Poole, and County of the said Town; his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Stockholm, May 21. A Courier is arrived from Carlscrona with the News, that the Men of War with the King of Sweden arrived there between Seven and Eight o'Clock on Saturday Evening, and that his Majesty would set out from thence for Stockholm as this Day.

Berlin, May 25. Last Sunday Afternoon the King of Prussia arrived from Spandau, at Charlottenburg, where he passed the Night. The next Morning his Prussian Majesty, after seeing the different Regiments enter this Capital, which are annually reviewed with the Troops in Garrison here, came to his Palace in Town, where he had a numerous Levée, at which the Foreign Ministers attended. On the 20th, his Majesty made a Promotion of General Officers as follows, viz. Majors General de Mayer, de Malachowsky; his Highness Prince D'Anhalt Bernbourg; Monf. de Wunsch; Monf. Krusmark, Commandant of the Regiment of Gens d'Armes; Monf. de Bulow, Commandant of the Regiment of Anspach-Bayreuth; to be Lieutenants-General; and the Colonels Baron de Keller, de Roffiere, de Lengenfeld, of Roffiere's Battalion, de Schwartz, de Rothkirch, de Billerbeck, of Krockow's Regiment of Fusiliers, de Bork, de Mitzlaff, and de Kleist, Commandant of the Regiment of Guards Carabiniers, to be Majors General.

On the 21st, 22d, and 23d Instant the King reviewed and exercised the Troops assembled in the Plain of Tempelhoff to the Number of Twenty thousand Men; who went through their several Exercises to the entire Satisfaction of his Majesty. This Morning the King, accompanied by the Prince Royal of Prussia, set out from Charlottenburg for Custrin, Stargard, &c. in order to review the Troops in Pomerania; from whence he proposes to return about the 28th or 29th Instant to Potsdam.

The Reigning Prince of Waldeck arrived here last Wednesday, and was immediately presented to the King of Prussia, and the rest of the Royal Family.
