Florence, May 18. On the 11th Instant in the Evening, the Court returned from Poggio a Caiano; and, on the 12th, the Great Duke performed the Ceremony of investing the Arch-Duke Ferdinand, his youngest Son, with the Ensigns of the Order of the Golden Fleece. This Ceremony was performed with great Solemnity; the Foreign Ministers were invited to it; the Nobility and Military Officers attended in Gala; and a Detachment of the Garrison was placed before the Palace, and fired three Rounds, which were answered by the Cannon of the Fortresses. The next Day, the 13th, (being the Anniversary of the Empre's Dowager's Birth-Day) was celebrated with the usual Ceremony; the Great Duke received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and the Nobility of both Sexes kissed his Hand. His Royal Highness afterwards dined in Publick. The Great Duchefs being indisposed did not appear that Day.

Copenhagen, May 26. The Corps of Danish Horse Guards were Yesterday reduced; the Men are to be incorporated into other Regiments, and the Officers will be placed as Vacancies offer. In the Room of this Corps, a Body of 300 Men, composed of Detachments from the different Regiments of

Dragoons, is to be formed, and to do Duty during the Summer Months, wherever the Court resides. In the Winter they are to return to their respective Regiments.

The Queen Dowager, accompanied by Prince Frederick, set out for Friedensbourg Yesterday.

Berlin, June 1. Last Wednesday Evening the King of Prussia, attended by his Royal Highness the Prince of Prussia, returned to Potzdam, from his Expedition into Pomerania.

This Morning early his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia set out from hence for his Country Seat at Rhinsberg, where he intends to pass the Summer Season.

Dresden, June 2. The Electress Dowager proposes to set out from Dresden To-morrow, on her Journey towards Aix la Chapelle.

On Tuesday last the Elector reviewed his own Regiment, and That called the Electress Dowager's, each consisting of a Thousand Men. They went through all their Exercises with great Steadiness and Regularity.

Brussels, June 7. All Alarms about the Plague being at an End, the Troops, that formed the Line in these Countries, are recalled, and ordered to join their several Regiments, and a free Intercourse is permitted every-where.

By the late frequent refreshing Showers of Rain that we have had here, the Country has entirely changed its Face, and there is now all the Appearance of a plentiful Harvest.
