St. James's, June 15, 1771.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday last the 11th Instant, about the Hour of Eleven at Night, the House of Elizabeth Hutchins, Widow, Farmer and Gardener, in the King's Road, Chelsea, was robbed by Nine Persons with Fire-Arms, and provided with Implements for breaking open Houses, Four of whom stood at the Door, and about the Outside of the House, while the other Five rushed into the same and plundered it, taking from the Person of the said Mrs. Hutchins, (to whom they presented a Pistol, and with bitter Imprecations threatened the Life of herself and her three small Children) One Gold Watch in a Green Dog-Skin Case, the Name on it William Plumky, N^o 2588. London, with a Steel Chain, and a Gold Seal having the Impression of a Head, the Stone Buckles out of her Shoes, and the Purse

out of her Pocket, containing about Ten Pounds, and also plundering the House of One Silver Salt-Cellar; Two large Table Spoons, Five Tea Spoons, one gadrooned Hand Waiter, Weight Nine Ounce, the Crest on it a Lion passant, One Piece of Lemon-coloured Silk, containing about Eighteen Yards, One Silver Milk Ewer, One Pint Silver Mug, One Pair of Tea-Tongs, the Silver Tops of a Set of Cuffers, and about 60 Guineas in a Purse; that they also bound the two Maid Servants, and shot one of the Men Servants, who died the next Day: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices in the same, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof: And also a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS (except as before excepted;) to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction of one or more of the Criminals.

SUFFOLK.

And the Parish of Chelsea do promise a further Sum of FIFTY POUNDS, viz. Forty Pounds thereof to be paid by the Church-Wardens of the said Parish, and the other Ten Pounds by the Treasurer of a former voluntary Subscription for the Detection of Felons.

N B. The Five Persons who entered the House are described to have been all in light-coloured Great Coats, and flapped Hats; Three of them appeared to be about Five Feet Five Inches high, the Two others about Five Feet Seven Inches; One of them seemed to be very old, of a yellow, swarthy Complexion, his Great Coat reaching down to his Heels. They all spoke broken English, and had the Appearance of Jews. After the Robbery, they were seen to go towards Hyde Park Corner.
