St. James's, July 2.

**L**AST Night the Ceremony of Christening of the Young Prince was performed in the Great Council-Chamber by his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury. His Royal Highness was named Braet-Augustus. The Sponsors were, his Serene Highness Prince Ernest of Mecklenburgh Sirelitz in Person; his Serene Highness Prince Maurice of Saxe Gotha, represented by the Earl of Hertford, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household; and her Serene Highness the Hereditary Princess of Hesse-Cassel, represented by the Countess of Egremont.

St. James's, July 2.

This Day the King and Queen, his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, his Royal Highness Prince Frederick Bishop of Osnabruck, and their Royal Highnesses the Princes and Princesses, went from the Queen's Palace to reside at Richmond and Kew during the Summer.

*Petersburgh, June 4.* Yesterday and this Morning there have been several dreadful Fires, but they are now happily extinguished: A very great Number of wooden Houses, and some of Brick, have been burnt; among which are the Hotel of the Corps of Marine Officers, and a Hemp Warehouse, in which however there were fortunately not above 10,000 Pood of Hemp in Store.

The Loss to the British Factory is far from considerable, but their Danger was very great, as many Magazines of combustible Goods were surrounded with Flames.
