AST Week feveral Shocks of an Earthquake were felt in the Cities and Villages of Veletri, Frascati, Castle Gandolfo, &c. but they did not cause any Damage. They were followed by a dreadful Hurricane and Storm of Hail of fuch extraordinary Size as entirely destroyed the Fruits of the Earth in the District of Sabina, and killed many Cattle.

Madrid, June 27. The Court returned To-day to this Capital from Aranjuez, in the usual Manner, except that the Princess of Asturias, on Account of her present Situation, dined and reposed herfelf, during the Heat of the Day, at Val de Mora, a Village about three Leagues from hence. Reelin, July 6. The heavy and incettant Rains,

which have fallen in this Country for these four Weeks pail, have done very great Damage. The most melancholy Accounts are received from Wer-ben in the Old Mark, no less than forty Villages and thirty-four Gentlemen's Country Seats having been laid under Water by the Elbe's again overflowing it's Banks, and forcing it's Way through the Dykes, which were broken by the great lnundation that happened laft Spring, and have not been fince fufficiently repaired. This is the fourth Time within these five Months that this Part of the Old Mark has been afflicted with this dreadiul Calamity,
