**T**HEIR Majesties, and their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Wales, the Bishop of Osnabrugh, Prince William, and the Princess Royal, propose to set out from Richmond To-morrow in the Afternoon, for Windsor, in order to be present at the Installation on Thursday next.

*Cadiz, June 15.* Several Swedish Ships are taken into his Catholick Majesty's Service, which are to be employed as Transports to bring Home some of the Regiments from the West Indies.

Several Licences are come down for Ships to go in the Flota; but the whole Number is not yet granted.

*Madrid, July 4.* The Harvest of every Kind of Grain promises this Year to be one of the finest and most plentiful that has been known in this Country for a long Time. The Silk Worms both in Valencia and Murcia have entirely failed. Last Year they had such an Abundance of Silk, as to admit of Exportation; but this Year they have barely sufficient for Home Consumption.

*Turin, July 6.* Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Dutchess of Savoy left this Place on Thursday last, and are gone to Moncalier for a Month, where the Duke proposes to drink the Mineral Waters near that Place.

The Comte de Khevenhuller, his Imperial Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary here, is preparing to leave this Place, upon his being appointed Grand Maître to the Archduke, who is to reside at Milan, and his Lady Grand Maitresse to the Archdutchess.

Mr. Freeman

If hew dow proceed in the Commission of Bankruptcy you have taken out against John Lamb yours House shall be shutt on Fyre, and you in it by God you shunt live one Day as we are 100 Brave Boys that are for Lamb and will soon Murder you and all that offer to take Lambs Goods, and this believe from one of the Hundred whose Name is
