OUR Apprehensions on the Re-Appearance of the Plague in Podolia and Volhynia begin to subside; the Letters received from those Provinces this Week bringing Accounts, that the Precautions immediately taken by the Directors of the Villages (where it broke out afresh, through the Covetousness of some People digging up and using the Effects which had belonged to those who had fallen Victims to the Distemper, and which had been buried to stop the Infection) have prevented it's spreading; and that not more than One Hundred Persons have been carried off by it.
