Cuftom-Houfe, London, November 15, 1771. Whereas by an AEI made in the 14th Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, for prevening Frauds, and regulating Abufes in His Majesty's Customs, it is enacted,

That if any Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes shall be shipped or put on board, to be carried forth to the. open Sus, from any one Port, Creek, or Member in this. Kingdom, to be landed at any other Place of this Realm, without a Sufferance or Warrant first had and obtained from the Officers of His Majesty's Customs, all such Wares and Merchandizes shall be forfeited and lost; and that the Master of every Ship or Vessel that shall lade or take in any fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes, shall, before the Vessel be removed or carried out of the Lading Port, take out a Cocquet or Cocquets, and become bound to His Majefly, with good Security, in the Value of the Goods, for the Delivery thereof in the Port or Place for which the fame shall be entered, or in fome other Port or Place within Great Britain, and to return a Certificate thereof in Six Months from the

Date of fach Cocquet or Cocquets, to the Officers to whom fuch Security hath been given.

And, by another Act paffed in the 11th Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to continue the Prohibition of the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, and Starch, it is by the 4th Section enacted, that the faid Act shall not extend to prohibit any Perfor or Perfons to ship or put on board any of the Commodifies aforefaid, to be carried Coastavise from any Pore, Creek, or Member of Great Britain to any other Port, Creek, or Member of the Same respectively, having such like Coast Cocquet or Sufferance for that Purpose and Such or like Security being first given for the landing and discharging the same in some other Port, Member, or Creek of the said Kingdom, and returning a Certificate in Six Months, as is required by Law in Cales where Goods, which are liable to Daties on Exportation, are carried Coastwife from one Port of Great-Britain to anot ber.

And whereas Several Masters of Coasting Visels bave lately taken on board great Quantities of Corn and other Grain at fome of the Out-Ports of this Kingdom, which have exceeded the Quantity for which any Suffe. ances bave been granted, or any Security given, purjuant to the Direction of the Acts before-mentioned; which Practice thereby affords an eafy Opportunity to export the faid Corn, Sc. to Foreign Parts, contrary to the Intent of the faid laft recited Act.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that no Person may pretend Ignorance in this Case, do broby give Notice, that all Corn and other Goods which shall be shipped, to be brought Coastwife, without such Sufferance, and before juch Security is given, will be ferent and projecuted according to Law.
