**I**N the Assembly of the States last Saturday, a Report was read from the Secret Committee, proposing a Prohibition of all Distillation of Spirits, on account of the Scarcity of Corn, of the Badness of the last Crop, and of the Difficulty of bringing it from Abroad before the approaching Winter. The House of Nobles agreed to the Prohibition in Towns, and for Sale; but that it should be permitted in the Country for private Use. The Clergy rejected the Prohibition entirely; and so did the Order of Peasants: But the Burghers agreed in all Respects with the Secret Committee. It is very probable the Clergy and Peasants may be brought to conform themselves to the Nobles; and that thus only the Distillation for Sale may be prohibited. The King has passed this last Week at Eckholmfund: His Majesty came to Town on Sunday; and last Night there was a Court.

*Milan, October 16.* His Royal Highness the Archduke Ferdinand arrived Yesterday in this Capital, amidst the Acclamations of a large Concourse of People. His Royal Highness was escorted by a Detachment of the Noble Hungarian Guards, to the Ducal Palace, where the Soldiers of the Garrison and the Duke of Modena's Horse-Guards were drawn up: After staying there some Time, his Royal Highness went on Foot to the Cathedral, with a numerous and brilliant Attendance; he walked between the Duke of Modena and the Hereditary Prince, Son of his Serene Highness, and the Princess of Modena led the Princess Beatrice. After the nuptial Benediction, Te Deum was sung under a Discharge of Cannon. Their Royal Highnesses afterwards returned to the Palace in the same Order, and there received the Compliments of the Ministers of State and principal Nobility of both Sexes.
