THE King of Prussia, who continues in perfect good Health, went this Morning on Horseback to visit the China Fabrick here; and afterwards reviewed Prince Frederick of Brunswick's Regiment on the Parade.

St. James's, December 28, 1771.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That John Perrin, of Rotherfield Grays in the County of Oxford, Blacksmith, went from Home on Friday the 9th of November last, to Henley upon Thames, where he staid some Hours, and was seen there between Nine and Ten in the Evening, but has not been since heard of; therefore there is great Reason to suspect that the said John Perrin has been murdered: If any Person will give Intelligence where the said John Perrin now resides, (if alive) he shall receive a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS, on Application to Mr. Newell, Town Clerk of Henley upon Thames: And, if it shall appear that the said John Perrin is murdered, His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in such Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the same, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a farther Encouragement, a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby promised to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as before excepted) to be paid on the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders, by Mr. Newell, Town Clerk of Henley upon Thames aforesaid.

N. B. The aforementioned John Perrin is about 60 Years of Age, lusty, and about five Feet ten Inches high; he had on a dark-coloured Thickset Frock, black Waistcoat, and Leather Breeches; wore his own dark brown Hair, and had a Scar on his Left Cheek.
