THE following Address of the Lord-Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin, in Common-Council assembled, having been transmitted, by his Excellency the Lord Viscount Townshend, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, to the Earl of Rochford one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been presented to His Majesty by his Lordship; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord-Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin.

Most Gracious Sovereign.

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord-Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin, in Common-Council assembled, deeply affected at any melancholy Event in your Majesty's Royal Family, embrace this Opportunity to express our sincere Condolance on the great Loss your Majesty has sustained in the Death of her Royal Highness the late Princess Dowager of Wales.

ruly sensible of the many Advantages arising to us from your Majesty's auspicious Reign, we cannot, without the greatest Anguish, behold your Majesty under the heavy Pressure of Domestick Sorrow, and Filial Affliction.

We sincerely wish, that your Majesty may be supported, in your present Situation, by your usual Fortitude, and Serenity of Mind; that Occasions of expressing our Sensibility of your Majesty's Feelings may seldom offer; but that your Majesty's Reign may be marked by an uninterrupted Series of Prosperity.

In Testimony whereof, we have caused the Common Seal of the said City to be hereunto affixed, this Twenty-sixth Day of February, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-two.
