Naples, February 18.

HIS Britannick Majesty's Frigate the Alarm sailed from hence last Sunday Morning for Genoa, where she is to wait the Arrival of his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.

Stockholm, February 18. In the Plenum of Wednesday last the House of Nobles rejected the Proposition of allowing the new Nobles to sit as Proxies, without being introduced by a Majority of 57 Votes.

The King has given the vacant Regiment of East Bothnia to Lieutenant Colonel Baltzar; and Count Putbus is appointed President of the Court of Justice in Pomerania.

Stockholm, February 25. Last Saturday the States were assembled in Pleno; when, after a long Debate in the House of Nobles, which lasted till One o'Clock in the Morning, it was resolved to consider, at the next Plenum, of proper Means to come to an Agreement with the other Orders, about the King's Assurances: Accordingly, the States met again in Pleno Yesterday; when, after a warm Debate in the House of Nobles, there was a Division upon the following Question: Those who are of Opinion that, 1st, The Preamble of the Assurances be according to the first Resolution of the Nobility; 2dly, That the 5th Paragraph stand as first proposed; 3dly, That a separate Article be inserted at the End of the Act of Assurance, with the strongest Reservation of the Privileges of the Nobility; 4thly, That a Representation to the other Orders be made about the 22d Paragraph; and 5thly, That, if the other Orders do not enter into the three first Points, the Nobility abide by their former Resolution; write *Ay*; those who are of a contrary Opinion write *No*: If the Noes have it, the Passage in the Preamble, relating to the Inactivity of the Officers of the Crown, is to go out; and in the Letter to his Majesty, which accompanies the Assurances, all the four Orders are to give the strongest Guaranty of the Privileges of the Nobility; and finally, if the other Orders do not enter into these two Points, the Nobility is to abide by it's former Resolution. The Noes carried it by 32 Votes.

Nothing remarkable has passed in the other Orders; and the Secret Committee has not met for some Time past, but is assembled To-day.

Hague, March 10. The Prince of Orange entered into his Twenty-fifth Year on Sunday; upon which Occasion Prince Lewis of Brunswick gave a great Entertainment in the Evening; and this Evening he gives a Ball upon the same Occasion.

The Prince of Orange notified this Morning in Person to the States-General, and the States of Holland, who are assembled, that her Royal Highness the Princess, his Consort, is with Child.

Whitehall, March 14.

The King has been pleased to appoint Molineux Shuldham, Esq; to be His Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Island of Newfoundland and all the Coast of Labrador, from the Entrance of Hudson's Streights to the River St. John, which discharges itself into the Sea, nearly opposite the West End of the Island of Anticosti, including that Island with any other small Islands on the said Coast of Labrador, and also the Islands of Madelaine in the Gulph of St. Lawrence, as also of all His Majesty's Forts and Garrisons erected and established, or that shall be erected and esta-

blished, in the said Islands of Newfoundland, Anticosti, and Madelaine, or on the Coasts of Labrador, within the Limits aforesaid.
