HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Mr. Quarme, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers: The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for the better regulating the future Mar-riages of the Royal Family. -

An A& for explaining and amending an A& made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for taking off the Inland Duty of One Shilling per Pound Weight upon all Black and Singlo Teas confumed in Great Britain; and for granting a Draw-back upon the Exportation of Teas to Ireland and the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time, upon such Indemnission to be made in respect thereof by the East India Company, as is therein mentioned; for permitting the Exportation of Teas in Smaller Quantities than One Lot to Ireland, or the Jaid Dominions in America; and for preventing Teas Seized and condemned from being consumed in Great-Britain; and for settling certain Doubts and Disputes which have arisen upon the said Act of Parliament.

An Ast for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia in that Part of Great-Britain called England, for One Year, beginning the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hun-

dred and seventy-two.

An Ast for further continuing Two Asts, made in the Sixth and Ninth Years of His Majesty's Reign, for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters, in His Majesty's Dominions in America.

An Act for allowing further Time for Invollment of Deeds and Wills made by Papists, and for Relief of

Protestant Purchasers.

En Act for clearing, depthening, repairing, maintaining, and improving, the Haven and Piers of Great Yarmouth; and for depthening and making more navigable the several Rivers emptying themselves into the faid Haven; and for preserving Ships wintering therein from Accidents by Fire. An Ast for making a Navigable Cut, or Canal,

from the River Dee, within the Liberties of the City of Chester, to or near Middlewich and Nantwich, in the County of Chester.

An Ast to explain an Ast passed in the Tenth Year of His present Mojesty's Reign, for paving, lighting, and watching, the Town of Plymouth, in the County of Devon; and for regulating the Carmen and Porters

within the faid Town.

An Ast to enable the Governor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty of the Company of Conservators of the Great Level of the Fens, commonly called Bedford Level, to borrow upon Bonds further Money upon Account of the Middle and South Levels, Part of the Said Great Level; and for establishing a further certain Fund for Payment of the Bonds of the Said Corporation, out of the faid Middle and South Levels.

An Ast for deepening, cleanfing, scowering, pre-ferwing, and maintaining, the Harbour of Port Glas-

gow; for enlarging and improving the Quays and Piers; for erecting new Breofts, Jettees, and Piers; and for regulating Ships, Lighters, and other Vessels, trading into, and going out of, the said Harbour; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An All to explain and amend an All, made in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Second, for improving the Navigation of the River Loyne, otherwise called Lune, and for building a Quay, or Wharf, near the Town of Lancaster, in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

An A& for lighting, cleanfing, and watching, the Streets, Lanes, and other Passingers, of the Burgh of Canongate, and the Liberties of Pleasance and Leithwynd, adjoining to the Royalty of the City of Edinburgh.

An Ad for the more effectual affelfing and collecting of the Rates for Relief of the Poor, in the Parish of St. Botolph Bishopgate, in the Liberties of the City of London.

An Act for lighting such Part of the Town of Islington, as lies in the Parish of St. Mary Islington, in the County of Middlesex; and for establishing a regular Nightly Watch therein.

An Act to amend an Act of the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and wi-dening the Stone Bridge, in the Town of Shrewsbury; and for appropriating Part of the Tolls, collected upon certain Roads leading to the Said Bridge, towards finishing the same; and for granting additional Terms to the several Acts for repairing the said Roads.

An Act to continue and enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty fixth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, for repairing and widening the Roads leading from Lobcimb Corner, in the Parish the Roads leading from Lobcimb Corner, in the Parish of Winterstow, to Hainham Bridge, in the County of Wilts; and from the West Corner of St. Ann's Street, in the City of New Sarum, to the Parishes of Landford and Brook, and from thence to Ealing; and from Landford aforesaid, through Ower and Testwood, to Ealing aforesaid, in the County of Scuthampton; and for repairing and widening the Road, from the Rumsey and Ringwood Turnpike Road, near the House of Francis Fry. to Lindbursh: and from a Place called of Francis Fry, to Lindhurst; and from a Place called Hampton Ford to Lamb's Corner, in the faid County of Southampton; and for repairing the Footways within the said City.

An Ast to continue, and render more effectual, several Acts, for repairing the Roads from the Parish of Enfield, in the County of Middlefex, to the Town of Hertford, and other Roads in the faid Ads mentioned; and also for repairing the Road from the End of the Town of Hertford to Amwell End, near Ware, in the

An Ast for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Ast, for repairing and widening the Road from the City of Norwich, to Scole Bridge, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of an Ast, made in the Tenth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing and widen-ing the Roads from the Borough of Bury St. Edmund's, to the Town of Newmarket, in the Counties of Suffolk and Cambridge; and from the South End of the Ferry Street in Brandon, to Bury St. Edmund's, in the faid County of Suffolk.
