SALISBURY RACES.

ON Tuesday the 8th of July, 1772, will be for on Salisbury Course, the King's Plate of One Hundred Guineas, by any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, not more than Six Years old, carrying 12 Stone, the best of Three Four-Mile Heats.
