ACCOUNTS were received on Saturday last from Marshal Romanzoff, that the Porte had agreed to a Cessation of Arms, and Congress, and had named Ismael Beg, (the Reis Effendi) and Osman Beg, (who was formerly his Reis Effendi) to be their Ambassadors Plenipotentiary: Her Imperial Majesty has appointed Count Gregory Orloff, and Mons. Obrescuff, to be her Ambassadors Plenipotentiary.

Her Imperial Majesty was graciously pleased, on Sunday last, to make a Present of Sixty Thousand Rubles to Mons. Obrescuff, and of Thirty Thousand to Mons. Levasshoff, as a Mark of her Favour, and in Consideration of the Services and Sufferings of those Ministers.

Florence, April 23. His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester arrived here Yesterday in perfect Health, and was received by the Great Duke and Dutches with every Mark of Politeness and Attention.

Berlin, May 2. This Morning his Prussian Majesty reviewed two Regiments of Infantry, and all the Cavalry of the Garrison, except the Hussars. It is expected that the General Review will take place before the 22d Instant.
