St. James's, May 18.

THIS Afternoon, between Three and Four o'Clock, His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester arrived from Italy, in perfect Health, and immediately waited on Their Majesties at Kew.

Stockholm, April 28. Last Saturday the States were assembled in Pleno for the first Time since the Holidays, and the House of Nobles took into Consideration the Report of the Secret Deputation concerning the Conduct of the Senators since the last Dyet, which occasioned a warm Debate of about five Hours. The House divided upon the following Question: *Those, who are of Opinion to approve the Report of the Secret Deputation, concerning the Conduct of the Senators since the last Dyet, according to the separate Votum of Mr. Brandtberg, are to write Ay; those who are of the contrary Opinion are to write No: If the Noes have it, the Report is to be rejected according to Mr. Von Poff's Votum, and the Confidence of the States is to be continued to all the Senators.* The Ayes were 277. The Noes 272.

It is thus decided, by a uniform Resolution of the four Orders, that the Senators Rudenskiold, Bielke, Ulric Scheffer, Hermanson, Beckfries, Posse, and Bark, shall be removed from their Places in the Senate.

The King came to Town from Eckholmsfund on Sunday Evening; and this Morning his Majesty held a Chapter of his Orders, to which all the Foreign Ministers were invited. There was no Promotion in this Chapter, but the Senators Ulric Scheffer, Hermanson, Beckfries, Posse, and Walwick, were invested with the Collar of the Order of Seraphim.

Vienna, May 6. Last Week the Court removed to Schonbrun, and on Monday next they will go to Laxemburgh, and remain there till the Beginning of June.
