OU are this Day affembled, in order to con-firm, in the Manner of your Ancestors, the Band of Union which ties you to me, me to you, and you to the whole Commonwealth : We muft therefore remember, with the most fensible Gratitude, the Benevolence of the Almighty, who has ordered Things fo, that this very antient Kingdom of the Swedes and Goths is still existing, after so many Foreign, as well as National, Shocks; and that I, on the Throne of my Ancestors, can yet addrefs Free, and Independent, States.

Affured of your Hearts, most fincerely purpofing to merit them, and to fix my Throne upon your Love and Felicity, the Publick Engagement, which you are going to enter into, would, in my Opinion, be needlefs, if antient Cuftom, and the Law of Swe-den, did not require it of you; unhappy the King, who wants the Tye of Oaths to fecure himfelf on the Throne; and who, not affured of the Hearts of his Subjects, is confirmined to reign only by the Force of Laws, when he cannot by the Love of his Subjects !

I need not put you in Mind of the Weightiness of the Engagement you are going to take; the States of Sweden know best the Extent of their Duty to themfelves and the Commonwealth ; may Concord and Harmony ever unite your Hearts; may Foreign Views, and private Gain, ever be facrificed to Publick Intereft ; may this alone be a perpetual Band of Union amongst you; and may the Ambition of any Part of you never raife any such Difturbances, as may endanger the Freedom, and Independency, of the whole Commonwealth !

Gentlemen of the Houfe of Nobles, Preferve always the Honour and Intrepidity of your Ancestors; be an Example to your Fellow-Citizens; and, as you are the First Order of the Kingdom, be also the First in Virtue, and Love of your Country.

Good Men of the Reverend Order of Clergy, May mutual Friendship, and Peace, Obedience to the Laws, Reverence to God, and the King, bear Witness to me, and the Country, of your Zeal Payment.

in the Execution of the Sacred Office with which you are entruited.

Good Men of the respectable Order of Burghers, Strive always with your Fellow Subjects, who shall contribute the most to the Publick Good : May the Fruits of the extensive Share, which belongs to you, be General Credit, and Confidence, uleful Institutions, frugal Living, and moderate Gain; which lead to fure, and certain, Wealth.

Good Men of the worthy Order of Peafants, May Piety, Diligence, Temperance, and old Swedifh Faith, and Modefty, be the ftrongeft Confirmation of the Honour always due to that Order, which gives Subfiftence to all the others; an Ho-nour, which the Swedish Peasants have in all Times attained.
