

been since got off, though not without considerable Damage; and the Naval Hospital having been blown down during the Continuance of the Storm, several Persons were killed, and a considerable Number wounded and maimed.

There are as yet no particular Accounts of the Damage sustained in the Islands of Nevis, St. Christopher, and Montserrat; but there is Reason to believe, that the Effects of the Storm have not been less fatal there than at Antigua, more especially in the Island of St. Christopher, at which Island, it is said, that thirty Ships and other Vessels were wrecked, a great Part of the Town of Basse Terre destroyed, the Court-House, which was a new spacious Building, razed to its Foundation, and the Fortrefs of Brimstone Hill, which is of considerable Strength, is reported to have sustained very considerable Damage.

*Vienna, November 11.* We are informed that the Armistice is prolonged to the Beginning of April, and that M. Obrescow is appointed sole Ambassador on the Part of Russia, to treat with the Grand Vizir's Reis Effendi at the new Congress which is opened at Bucharest.

*Hamburgh, November 20.* A Notification was published the Day before Yesterday at Altona, by the President M. de Gheler, encouraging the Merchants of that City to send off by Shipping all Kinds of Provisions to the Danish West India Islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. Jean, for the Relief of the Inhabitants who have been great Sufferers by the general Devastation spread over those Islands by the late violent Hurricane.
