And that one or more Letters of the same Sort were that Night also left, and sound in different Parts of the Town: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and leaving the said Letters, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Persons who actually wrote the said Letters) such a sell discover his here are their decemblic ters) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be or Accomplices werein, apprehended and convicted thereof.
