

St. James's, March 13, 1773.

Whereas it has been represented to the King, That, on Sunday Night last, the 7th Instant, the Pond at Sandpit Gate, in Windsor Great Park, by the Keeper's House, and also another Pond at the Isle of Wight Gate, going into the Forest, were drawn and robbed by some Person or Persons unknown; and that, in the Night between Monday and Tuesday last, the 8th and 9th Instant, some Person or Persons unknown broke into a Paddock in the said Park, close to the Keeper's Lodge, and there killed a Brace of Stags, cut off their Heads and Legs, and pounced them, and took their Carcases away: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Offences abovementioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them, who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the same, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; and also a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS, to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders.

The Committee appointed to carry into Execution the Resolution of the Court of Common Council of the 25th Instant, that Mr. Chamberlain do pay out of the Chamber of this City, a Sum not exceeding Two Thousand Pounds, for allowing a Bounty of Four Shillings a Quarter for the first Ten Thousand Quarters of Foreign Wheat of a certain Quality, which shall be imported into the Port of London, between the last Day of March instant and the Thirtieth Day of June next, do hereby give Notice,

That the Wheat to be imported shall be weighed by a Cornmeter on Board the Ship or Vessel wherein such Wheat is imported, at the Time it is measured for Delivery;

That not less than four Bushels shall be weighed of every five Quarters of a Part or the Whole of a Cargo, as it shall happen to be delivered;

That no Wheat shall be intitled to this Bounty that does not weigh 59 Pounds net the Bushel;

That two Shillings shall be paid to the Meter for his weighing of forty Bushels of every fifty Quarters of the said Wheat, provided the Number of Bushels weighed is charged in his Certificate.

Certificates, upon Oath, from the Master of the importing Vessel, and the Meter that shall measure and weigh such Wheat, are required to be sworn to before the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, or any other Magistrate sitting at the Mansion-house; which Certificates are to be had gratis at the Corn Meters Office in Harp-Lane, Tower-Street.

The Ship, Master, and Meter's Certificates to be delivered to the Committee, who will sit in the Council Chamber in Guildhall, on Wednesdays the 21st of April next, and the first and third Wednesday in the following Months; at which Times and Place the Committee will receive all Claims for the said Bounty.
