**T**HE Earl of Dartmouth, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has this Day received a Letter, dated the 22d of February, from Major-General Dalrymple; Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Troops in the Island of St. Vincent, containing an Account of the total Reduction of the Charibs; and inclosing the Copy of a Treaty entered into with the said Charibs, by which they submit themselves entirely to His Majesty; and cede to His Majesty a large Tract of very valuable Land.

Major-General Dalrymple transmits the following Returns of the Loss sustained by His Majesty's Troops, and highly commends their Activity, Bravery, and Patience, in the Course of this difficult and fatiguing Service.

The Committee appointed to carry into Execution the Resolution of the Court of Common Council of the 25th Instant, that Mr. Chamberlain do pay out of the Chamber of this City, a Sum not exceeding Two Thousand Pounds, for allowing a Bounty of Four Shillings a Quarter for the first Ten Thousand Quarters of Foreign Wheat of a certain Quality, which shall be imported into the Port of London, between the last Day of March instant and the Thirtieth Day of June next, do hereby give Notice,

That the Wheat to be imported shall be weighed by a Cornmeter on Board the Ship or Vessel wherein such Wheat is imported, at the Time it is measured for Delivery;

That not less than four Bushels shall be weighed of every five Quarters of a Part or the Whole of a Cargo, as it shall happen to be delivered;

That no Wheat shall be intitled to this Bounty that does not weigh 59 Pounds net the Bushel;

That two Shillings shall be paid to the Meter for his weighing of forty Bushels of every fifty Quarters of the said Wheat, provided the Number of Bushels weighed is charged in his Certificate.
