THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, acquainting them, that the Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act, made in the Sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for the better Preservation of Timber Trees, and of Woods, and Underwoods, and for the further Preservation of Roots, Shrubs, and Plants, to Poplar, Alder, Maple, Larch, and Horn-beams.

An Act for the better Regulation and Government of the Pilots conducting Ships and Vessels to and out of the Port of King's Lynn; and of the Bridgemen conducting Gangs of Lighters or Barges to and from the same; and for laying down Moorings in the Harbour of the said Port; and for preventing Mischiefs by Fire thereon.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money, for the Purpose of rebuilding the Common Goal of the County of Essex.

An Act to incorporate certain Persons, therein named, and their Successors, with proper Powers, for the Purpose of establishing one or more Glass Manufactories within the Kingdom of Great Britain; and for the more effectually supporting and conducting the same, upon an improved Plan, in a peculiar Manner, calculated for the casting of large Plate Glass.

An Act for paving, lighting, and cleansing, the Streets, Lanes, and Places, within the Town of Brighton, in the County of Sussex; for removing Nuisances and Annoyances, and preventing the like for the future; for holding and regulating a Market within the said Town; for building and repairing Groyns, in order to render the Coast safe and commodious for Ships or Vessels to unload and land Sea Coal, Culm, and other Coal, for the Use of the Inhabitants of the said Town; and for laying a Duty thereon; and for other Purposes.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the Ninth Year of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for laying open and widening certain Ways and Passages within the Town of Birmingham; and for cleansing and lighting the Streets, Lanes, Ways, and Passages there; and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions therein; and for widening certain other Streets and Places; for establishing a Nightly Watch; and for regulating Carts and Carmen employed in the said Town.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act, made in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for discharging the Corporation of the Governor, Bailiff, and Commonalty, of the Company of Conser-

vators of the Great Level of the Fens, commonly called Bedford Level, from a Debt due to the Duke of Bedford, and Earl of Lincoln; and for enabling the Proprietors of Lands in the North Level, Part of the said Great Level, to raise Money, to discharge the Proportion of the said North Level in the Debts of the said Corporation; and for ascertaining and appropriating the Taxes to be laid on the said North Level; and for the more effectual draining and preserving the said North Level, and divers Lands adjoining thereto, in the Manor of Crowland, so far as the same relates to the several Fen Lands lying in the second District in the said Act described.

An Act for making and extending the Navigation of the River Bure (commonly called the North River) by and from Coltisball, to Aylsham Bridge, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for enlarging the Term, and varying the Powers, granted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, for repairing and widening the several Roads leading into the Town of Ross in the County of Hereford.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act, made in the Fifth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from Newcastle under Line to Haslop, and from Middlebills to the Macclesfield Turnpike Road near Buxton; and also the Road branching out of the said first mentioned Road at Cobridge, to Burslem, and to the Uttoxeter Turnpike Road at Shelton, in the County of Stafford; and for amending several other Roads adjoining thereto.

An Act for repairing the Road from the Royal Oak on Wrotham Heath, to the Town of Wrotham, in the County of Kent, and from thence to Foot's Cray; and from the said Royal Oak, to the Town of Maidstone, in the said County.

An Act for continuing the Term, and enlarging the Powers, of an Act, made in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, for repairing the Road from Cherill, through Calne, to Studley Bridge, and from Cherill to the Three Mile Burrough, at the Top of Cherill Hill, in the County of Wilts.

An Act for continuing the Term, and enlarging the Powers, of an Act passed in the Eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for repairing and widening the Road from the Way Post, in the Parish of Hardingston, in the County of Northampton, to Old Stratford in the said County.

An Act for enlarging the Terms and Powers of two Acts, of the Twentieth and Twenty-sixth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty, for repairing the High Road leading from the City of Durham in the County of Durham, to Tyne Bridge in the said County.

WHETHERAS there was this Day read at this Board, the humble Petition of several Merchants in London, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, trading to and from the Ports of Spain, within

within the Streights of Gibraltar, humbly praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to command, that the Quarantine may be taken off all Ships and Vessels arriving in Great Britain, from any of the Ports of Spain, situate within the Streights, upon producing clean Bills of Health; — His Majesty having taken the said Petition into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken off, so far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, Minorca, or Gibraltar; and that such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without opening, unpacking, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, provided that they have no Cotton-Wool on Board; that they bring with them clean Bills of Health; and that the Master, or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Custom-house Officer, or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they are bound to; that they did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship during the Voyage, and are free from all Infection: — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
