The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this Day read at this Board, the humble Petition of several Merchants in London, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, trading to and from the Ports of Spain, within the Streights of Gibraltar, humbly praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to command, that the Quarantine may be taken off all Ships and Vessels arriving in Great Britain, from any of the Ports of Spain, situate within the Streights, upon producing clean Bills of Health; — His Majesty having taken the said Petition into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken off, so far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, Minorca, or Gibraltar; and that such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without opening, unpacking, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, provided that they have no Cotton-Wool on Board; that they bring with them clean Bills of Health; and that the Master, or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Custom-house Officer, or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they are bound to; that they did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship during the Voyage, and are free from all Infection: — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS Thomas Marten, an Officer of the Customs, Thomas Plane, and Six others of the Crew of His Majesty's Cutter the *Meredith*, commanded by Lieutenant *Bravil Friend*, on a Cruise in *Shorcham Bay*, being on the Look-out in the Boat belonging to the said Cutter, about Four o'Clock in the Morning of the 2d of February last, near a Place called *Portobella Gap*, discovered a large Boat coming in for the Land, loaded with Tea and Brandy, which having seized, together with the Boat, the Crew thereof hallooed to a Cutter at a Distance, which immediately came to their Assistance; and the People on Board swore, if the Seizure was not quitted, they would run them down and set them a swimming for their Lives; and accordingly run foul and damaged the King's Boat, threw said Thomas Martin out of the Smuggling Boat into the King's Boat, and also threw a Rope round the Neck of the said Thomas Plane, and were near drawing him overboard, rescued the Boat with all the Goods except one Bag of Tea, and

and proceeded to Sea with the said Boat and Smuggling Cutter.

And whereas John Stokes, Midshipman of His Majesty's said Cutter the Meredith, together with Lucas Reeve, Brian Nowland, and Seven others of the Crew of the said Cutter, being, on the 6th of the said Month, on the Look-out, off the With Rails, with the Gigg belonging to the said Cutter, they observed a large Cutter standing in from Sea drop her Boat from a Stern near the Shore, which they gave Chace to, but could not get up with her until she was ashore; where, upon their endeavouring to seize the Goods, there came down and surrounded the Boat about One hundred Smugglers, consisting of Horsemen and Foot, who swore they would murder every Person belonging to the Boat, if they offered to seize the Goods; and immediately began to throw Stones, and therewith knocked down the aforesaid Lucas Reeve and Brian Nowland, and carried off all the Goods except Seven Half Ankers of Brandy, which, together with the Boat, the Officers seized, and carried to the Custom-House at Shoreham.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS, to any Person who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the Offenders concerned in either of the said Assaults and Rescues, to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs, upon Conviction.

And if any of the said Offenders shall, within three Months from the Date hereof, discover his Accomplices, so that Two of them at least may be apprehended and convicted, the Offender making such Discovery shall be entitled to the like Reward, and be discharged of such his Offence.
