A PROCLĀMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Spips of War.

GEORGE

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen, and Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council. to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or fuch Officers as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; and all fuch Able-bodied Lancmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid. shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, reliding at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after fuch Men shall have been Three Times mustered: And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the feveral Men fo entering themselves, as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain, of the said Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty Money; We do hereby Declare and Command, That such Seamen, or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on hoard any other of Our said Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this Day read at this Board, the humble Petition of feveral Merchants in London, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, trading to and from the Ports of Spain. within the Streights of Gibraltar, humbly praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that His Majelty will be graciously pleased to command, that the Quarantine may be taken off all Ships and Veffels arriving in Great Britain, from any of the Ports of Spain, fituate within the Streights, upon producing clean Bills of Health; — His Majesty having taken the said Petition into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, fo far as may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present substiting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken of, so far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, Minorca, or Gibraltar; and that fuch Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without opening, unpacking, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, provided that they have no Cotton-Wool on Board; that they bring with them clean Bills of Health; and that the Masser, or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Cultum house Officer, or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they are bound to; that they did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship during the Voyage, and are free from all Infection: — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

SUFFOLK.

And, as a farther Encouragement, I the Said Robert Barlow do hereby promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as before excepted) to be paid by me as my House in Boston aforesaid, upon the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders.
