## A P R O C L A M A T I O N,

For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

G E O R G E R.

**W**HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all such Seamen, and Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or such Officers as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; and all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, residing at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after such Men shall have been Three Times mustered: And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the several Men so entering themselves, as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatwain, of the said Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty Money; We do hereby Declare and Command, That such Seamen, or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on board any other of Our said Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, the Twenty-second Day of *April*, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, and in the Thirteenth Year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS there was this Day read at this Board, the humble Petition of several Merchants in London, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, trading to and from the Ports of Spain, within the Streights of Gibraltar, humbly praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to command, that the Quarantine may be taken off all Ships and Vessels arriving in Great Britain, from any of the Ports of Spain, situate within the Streights, upon producing clean Bills of Health; — His Majesty having taken the said Petition into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, be taken off, so far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, Minorca, or Gibraltar; and that such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without opening, unpacking, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, provided that they have no Cotton-Wool on Board; that they bring with them clean Bills of Health; and that the Master, or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Custom-house Officer, or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they are bound to; that they did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Communication with any infected Ship during the Voyage, and are free from all Infection: — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

St. James's, April 10, 1773.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Thursday the 25th Day of March last past, about Ten of the Clock at Night, two loaded Guns were discharged against the Windows of the Keeping Room of Robert Barlow, Esq; of Boston in the County of Lincoln, in which his Wife, Nephew and Niece were sitting; and that many Balls entered the said Room, one of which wounded Mrs. Barlow on the Top of her Head, and caused a great Effusion of Blood: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in so daring and wicked an Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually fired the said Guns) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, I the said Robert Barlow do hereby promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as before excepted) to be paid by me at my House in Boston aforesaid, upon the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders.

The Committee appointed to carry into Execution the Resolution of the Court of Common Council of the 25th Instant, that Mr. Chamberlain do pay out of the Chamber of this City, a Sum not exceeding Two Thousand Pounds, for allowing a Bounty of Four Shillings a Quarter for the first Ten Thousand Quarters of Foreign Wheat of a certain Quality, which shall be imported into the Port of London, between the last Day of March instant and the Thirtieth Day of June next, do hereby give Notice,

That the Wheat to be imported shall be weighed by a Cornmeter on Board the Ship or Vessel wherein such Wheat is imported, at the Time it is measured for Delivery;

That not less than four Bushels shall be weighed of every five Quarters of a Part or the Whole of a Cargo, as it shall happen to be delivered;

That no Wheat shall be intitled to this Bounty that does not weigh 59 Pounds net the Bushel;

That two Shillings shall be paid to the Meter for his weighing of forty Bushels of every fifty Quarters of the said Wheat, provided the Number of Bushels weighed is charged in his Certificate.

Certificates, upon Oath, from the Master of the importing Vessel, and the Meter that shall measure and weigh such Wheat, are required to be sworn to before the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, or any other Magistrate sitting at the Mansion-house; which Certificates are to be had gratis at the Corn Meters Office in Harp-Lane, Tower-Street.

The Ship, Master, and Meter's Certificates to be delivered to the Committee, who will sit in the Council

Chamber in Guildhall, on Wednesday: the 21st of April next, and the first and third Wednesday in the following Months; at which Times and Place the Committee will receive all Claims for the said Bounty.
