PROCLAMATION, For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.
HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen, and Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council. to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promife and declare, I hat all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, volunturily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or such Officers as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; and all fuch Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, residing at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after such Men shall have been Three Times mustered: And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the feveral Men fo entering themselves, as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain, of the said Ship or Vest where they stall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abules by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on board any other Cur Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby Declare and Command, That such Seamen, or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter the nielves on board any other of Our said Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fecond Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, and in the Thirteenth Year of Our Reign.
