present is; in the mean time his Ministers and Officers in the Dutchy of Juliers, and the County of Bergs, are endeavouring to raife a confiderable Sum of money, to make preparations for the marriage of the young Printcels of Newbourg, who it's faid, will in few dayes be de-clared Empress. The Inhabitants of this Diocels suffer extremely by the incurhons of the French of Maestricht, who oblige them to pay double Contributions. From Limburg on the Laha of the 5th in tant they write, that the Luneaburg Troops advanced fli I towards the Khine, but that they took but flow marches, by reason of the bad weather, and that the Duke of Zell was expected in perion with his faid Troops, Yellerday the Muniter Troops arrived near Alaenkircken and Hackenbourg, they, as well as the Lunenburg, march directly towards Coblenia, where they will pass the Khin. From Mariendal they weile, I hat the Electoral Prince of Sixony arrived the 29 past with 1400 Horse near that place, being on his marck towards the Imperial Army.

Charleville, ' & b. 6. The Mareschal de Crequi having, it's faid, had advice that the Spaniards had an intention to possess the nsclyes of Bouillan, which belongs to the Elector of Cologne, to prevent them marched thicher with a Body of men he had drawn together, and summaned the Governor to receive a French Garison, which he refused; but the Mareschal setting down before the place to Besiege it, the Governor the Baron Berlo surrendred it the 30 past. The 3d instant the Mareschas marched towards Virten in the Countrey of Luxemburg, where he will quarter his Troops, and expect an acc unt of the march of the Lunenburg and Munfter Troops, who march fo flowly, that we are not in any pain for what they will enterprize this Campagne; and even if they should enter upon any action, the Mareschai de Crequi will have a sufficient Army to oppose them; the Mareschal de Schomberg i gone towards Mabeuge, his Troops are quartered between the Sambre and the Meufe to refresh them. We hear not any thing of the Enemy, who remains very fill.

Bruffels, Octob. 9. The Confederate Army continues encamped near Tillemont, though it's expected the Troops will now in few dayes separate, and go into Winter q atters; some Regiments have already lest the Armyjon Wednesday last 2 Regiments of Spanish Horse mirched to Ghent, and the day following two Regiments more with fix Companies of Dragoons, marched towards Sto ner, where they are to winter. The Duke of Ofnabrug is returned from Antwerp to the Army, where, it's faid, he received a confiderable Sum of mony. Yesterday arrived the Ordinary from Spain, the most considerable News it brought, was the Declaration of the King of Spains Marriage with the Emperors daughter. From Liege of the 7th instant they write, that the French have demo'ished Marche en Famine and Bastogne, to open 2 free passage between Limburg and Sedan: That the Baron Berlo, Governor of the Castle of Bouillon, was come to Liege, having, as it's said, justified himself, as to the furrendring of that place, the whole Garifon having absolutely refused to discharge a Musket against the French 'The Mareschal Schomberg is about Binche and Mabeuge with the French Army, which will go speedily into Winter-quarters, according to the report of fome Prisoners that have been lately taken.

Paris, Offiob. 10. The 6th instant, the Sieur Containis, who is lately arrived here in quality of Ambassador Extraordinary from the Republick of Vince, had his first publick Audience of his Majesty at Visites, to which he was conducted by the Marcischal de Loge, and the Introductor of Ambassadors: And yesterday the Popes Nuncio had likewise Andience of his Majesty, to acquaint him with the elevation of Cardinal Oiefal-

chi to the Papacy. The 5th instant was Christned at St Con the young Duke of Chartes, and Madamoiselle de Chartres, in the pretence of their Majesties, and several persons of the greatest quality; the Prince of Conde was Godfather, and the great Dutchels of Tufcany Gudmother to the Duke of Chartres, was named l'hilippe; and the Duke of Eliginen was Godfather, and Madam de Cuife Godmother to Madamottelle de Chartes, who was named Ligabeth Charlotte. We are told of a fresh Supply that is to be sene from Thinson to Messing, from whence we are expeding to hear of fome confiderable enterprize. Our Letters from Afface give us an account, that on the 5th inflant the Imperial Army, under the command of the Duke of Lor-rain, was near Abmf lit, about Bafte, and that his High-nels had defigned to have passed through the Territory of the Bishop of East, but that the Swife Cantons had prayed him that he would not, to whose instance he had in part yielded, and perhaps the rather, for that some French Troops had Been detached to affift the Suiffers, to oppose his passage: And that the 61b ioftant, the Duke of Luxemburgh repassed the Rhine with his Army, which was not longer able to subfift on the other side. his Army, which was not longer able to lubhit on the other hade. From F anders, and those parts they write, That our Troops having taken Bounlon, they are fortifying it, as likewife Arion near Luxemburg, to prevent the incursions of the Bully, Rochefort and Marche on Famine they have demolished. The Forces commanded by the Marcheal de Schomberg, are in quarters of refreshment between the Sambre and the Mensi, from whence it's thought they will remove about the latter end of this month into Winter-quarters. According to our last advices, the Mareschal de Crequi was near Cirque on the Mofelle, with 16 or 17000 men, composed of feveral detachements as well from the Army in Flanders, as that in Alface, to make head against the Lunenbu g and Munster Troops who march on that fide, though very flowly.
