As our Welch gentlemen have taken Mr Collins and Freeman up as Hudglish or fransh men and as no Ingliah or french man Should Coume into our Contry to taiké our Land fran us We will if You and all the Sirvents of Mr Freeman and Collins dunt go directly go from Pen-de-rimark Burn Your Houfe Murder You and all the English famely and Mr Brown of the fourres and kiil Your Cattle if You Dont all go oute of the Contry in a few days you shall be murdered By god and Your houfes sett on fire and Yourre Horses all killed by us and a soo more brave Welch men
