LAST Wednesday Baron Charles Sparre, late Governor of Gefle, was installed Grand Governor of Stockholm, in the room of General Rudbeck; and the same Day his Majesty nominated Count Gyllenstolpe to be Governor of Gefle.

His Majesty has been also pleased to appoint Baron Frederick Sparre to be Chancellor of the Court, in the room of Baron Bunge, lately promoted to the Dignity of Senator.

Orders for the Court's Change of Mourning, on Sunday next, the 18th Instant, for the late Princess Louisa of Saxe Gotha, Widow of the late Prince John Augustus of Saxe Gotha, Uncle to His present Majesty, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Fans, and Tippets; or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuffs, with Black Ribbons.

The Men to wear Black Coats, and Black, or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Waistcoats full trimmed, coloured Swords and Buckles.

And on Sunday, the 25th Instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.
