Naples, October 26. E have Accounts from Palermo of fresh Troubles: some of the principal Burghers, which Class is distinguished there by the Name of the Maestranza or Artificers, who were concerned in the late Revolution, fearing a just Punishment, signed a Memorial to be presented to his Sicilian Majesty, imploring his Majesty's Pardon, and requesting the Return of the Duke Fogliani; others of the same Class, who had been applied to, refused to sign this Memorial, without previously consulting the lower Class of People, who immediately, upon being informed thereof, went to the Palace of the Archbishop, whom they obliged to appear in his Balcony, and tear the Memorial in their Presence, declaring at the same Time, that, if they should hear any more of a Desire to recall the Vice-Roy, they would even attack, and drive him from Mes-

The Maestranza, who continue in Possession of the City of Palermo, thinking it necessary to make an Example of some of the lower Class, wno had taken Advantage of the Troubles, to commit the most daring Robberies, seized upon several of them, some of whom were tried and condemned to die; one of the latter offered to make a great Discovery, if they would spare his Life; which being granted, he declared himself engaged in a Conspiracy, with many others, to murder the Nobility, and seize upon the City; and that their Rendezvous was in a Cavern near the Town; which Place being accordingly furrounded, above Three Hundred of this armed Rabble have been taken, the Attackers having found Means to drive them out of their ftrong Hold by Smoke. The Prisons at Palermo are now full, and three of the chief Conspirators have been executed.
