Naples, February 8.

NEW S having been received at Malta, that an Armament was preparing in the Ports of Tunis and Algiers, to cruize on the Coast of Tuscany, the Grand Master ordered two Ships of War to sail directly for that Coast, but the bad Weather has forced them to return to Malta. Two of his Sicilian Majesty's Frigates are likewise getting ready to oppose the above-mentioned Armament.

The Eruption of Mount Vesuvius is at an End. Letters received from Catania give an Account, that on the 4th of last Month there began a violent Eruption from the Sides of Mount Ætna, in the middle Region, about Fourteen Miles from that City; and that large Stones had been thrown to the Distance of four Miles.
