Two of his Sicilian Majesty's Frigates are likewise getting ready to oppose the abovementioned Armament.

The Eruption of Mount Vesuvius is at an End. Letters received from Catania give an Account, that on the 4th of last Month there began a violent Eruption from the Sides of Mount Ætna, in the middle Region, about Fourteen Miles from that City; and that large Stones had been thrown to the

Distance of four Miles.
