Weftminfter, March 31. HIS Day His Majefty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, was fent with a Mef-fage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers : The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Affent to
