EARLY this Morning the Nuncio received by a Courier an Account of the Death of the Pope, which happened in the Night of the 21st Instant.

Dresden, October 2. Their Serene Highnesses the Elector and Reigning Electress of Saxony, with the Electoral Family and Court, returned last Friday from Pilnitz, for the Winter, to Potsdam.

WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in the Night between the 31st of August and the 1st Instant, some Persons unknown broke in at one of the Windows in the Long Room of His Majesty's Custom-House at Plymouth, and broke open the Custom-er's, Comptroller's, and four other Desks; in one of which was deposited upwards of Six Pounds, Private Property, which was feloniously taken and carried away, and a File and an Iron Draw-Pin, used by Carpenters, (both which appear to have been stole the same Night out of a Tool-Chest lodged in a Shipwright's Yard) were left behind.

WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the Night of the 31st of July last, the House erected on Lubarne Downs, in the Parish of Marzow in the County of Cornwall, containing the Tools and Implements necessary for carrying on the Marzow Porth Canal, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire and burnt, together with the Timber placed on the Saw-Pit, and several other Pieces of Timber of Oak, Elm, and Balk, lying on the Lands adjoining to the Canal, which were likewise collected together and burnt: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to and burning the said House and Timber, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to

any Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to and burning the said House and Timber, (except the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the said House and Timber) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
