Modena, August 8.

**O**N Thursday last died, at the Palace of Rivalta, her Serene Highness Elizabeth-Ernestine d'Este, Princess of Modena, in the 34th Year of her Age.

Berlin, August 20. His Prussian Majesty passed through this Place, at Four o'Clock last Monday Morning, on his Way to Silesia: He is accompanied by Prince Charles of Wirtemberg and General Lentulus; the Prince Royal of Prussia having taken the same Route the Day before.

The Pregnancy of the Princess Royal of Prussia was declared to his Prussian Majesty before his Departure from Potsdam.

Hamburg, August 23. Last Saturday Morning his Serene Highness the Reigning Duke of Mecklenbourg-Schwérin set out from the Dutchess's Hotel, with Prince Frederick and the Princess Sophia, on their Return to Ludwigslust.

Last Friday Morning died here Senator Justus Vincent Ritter, in the 59th Year of his Age: He was chosen a Member of the Senate in 1762.
