

St. James's, November 15, 1774.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Sunday Night last, at Half an Hour past Nine o'Clock, a Fire broke out in the Timber Yard of Mr. Thomas Flight, in the old Artillery Ground adjoining to Tabernacle Walk, which burnt a very great Quantity of Timber, Deals, and other Things, together with all the Buildings belonging to the said Yard; and that there is great Reason to believe the same was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire in three Places; and that three Persons were seen getting over the Wall into Tabernacle Walk just before the Fire was discovered, one of whom was heard to say, "We have done it effectually." His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person or Persons concerned therein, (except the Person or Persons who did actually set Fire to the same) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
