Zulkiew in Poland, Nov. 12. HE King being returned hither from the Camp, (after having given the necessary orders for the patting his Troops into Winterquarters) where he found the Queen, the persons of quality which had remained ar Leopel, forthwith repaired to this place, to pay their respects to his Majesty. The King has refolved in May next to take his journey to saragoft to confirm the Priviledger of the Kingdom of Arragon, and in the mean time has fent to fignifie this his refolucion to the States of that Kingdom.

Marfeilles, Nov. 24. We have advice that ten Gatlies are arrived upon the Coast from Messina, the other aftern being ordered to temain and winter there, long patfengers that clime in them are already landed, and confirm the taking of the Scale staby the Duke de Vivonne, which is a fliccell of very great importance, for that is opens the Countrey to the Mellineles, from whence they will be able to draw Provisions and other necessaries, which before they could not have from abroad.
