July, 1772, to direct (amongft other Things) That all Ships and Veffels whatfoever, having Cotton-Wool on Board, (except Ships and Veffels from America or the Weff-Indies with that Commodity on Board, the Produce of those Parts) then arrived, or that hould thereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guerafey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fould make their Quarantine Forty Days, which was to commerce and be computed from the Day each Ship and Vefiel should come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before: And where it hath been represented to His Ma-jefty at this Board, that the Continuance of the faid Quarantine is very data montal to the Commerce of His Majefty's Sobject, and more particularly to the Montal n arried on in the County of Lanca-Martin II. Majeffy taking the fame into Confidera-tion, and deaming it no longer necessary for the public Sarety, that all Ships and Veffels whatfoever, having Cotton-Wool on Board, should be subject to the Rules of Quarantine, is pleafed, with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, to order, that all fuch Ships and Veffels, not coming from any of the Ports or Flaces from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, be permitted to land their respective Corposes without opening and airing, and without any Redraine on Account of Quatantine: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Mage" r'_{3} Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Wardon of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid refpective Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necefiary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Confantinople, November 17. On Thursday the 10th of last Month, a Russian Frigate, having on Board Brigadier Borozow and faveral Ruffian Officers, arrived here from the Archipelago, with three of their Creizers. Haffan Bafhaw, now Captain Bafhaw, arrived at the fame Time with his Fleet from the Dardamelles, accompanied by three Algerines, three Tu-nifines, and a large Fleet of Merchant-Ships of all Nations, (except those of Spain and Denmark) a Circumftance never remembered here. The Captain Bathaw made his public Entry on Sunday, and re-ceived a Pelice from the Grand Signor in his Kiofk, and was faluted by all the Ships of War in the Port.

By the late fevere and tempeiluous Weather great Damage has been done to the Shipping. Vienna, December 14. The very fevere Froit,

which we have had here for upwards of the eeWeeks, and of which there has been no Example fince the Year 1740, is now fucceeded by a jentle haw, though it is hardly to be expected that the Change will be lafting.

The Turkith Poft has been delayed feveral Days later than ordinary by the great Fell of Snow. Berlin, December 17. Their Polist Highneffes the Prince and Spincers Fordband of Fruffia arrived here on Wedneiday last from Fredericksfeldt.
