Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Sunday Night, the 18th of December last, a strong Box was stolen out of the House of David D'Aguilar, Esq; in Kemmet-Street in the Minorities, containing the following Things, viz. a Diamond Bow; a Pair of fine Drop Ear-rings; three Diamond Stars; one large Diamond Pin in the Shape of a Heart, set round with small Diamonds; one Pin in the Shape of a Half Moon; six round Diamond Pins for the Head, made occasionally to wear in Buttons; one Picture Ring set in Diamonds; one Cypher Ring ditto, containing about 140 small Stones on a Garnet; one yellow Diamond Ring, set round with small Brilliants; one large single Stone in a Ring; one Hoop Ring, small Brilliants, one Stone out; one Pair of fine Pearl Bracelets with Diamond Locketts, cyphered D d; two Piquet Marks, Gold and Silver; a Pair of mall Pearl Ear-rings, and one Pearl Pin; one chased Gold Case belonging to a Gold Watch; a black Sbagreen Pocket-Book mounted in Gold, on the Inside there is a Place to contain an oval Picture; one Gold Etawee in the Shape of a Mace, and a Cornelian cyphered DA screws on at the End; one curious Ink-stand, with junary other Articles in it, the Top a very large Medal supposed to be Gold, and a Seal marked RDA; two Spring Locks or Toss, the one Gold, the other Silver, for a small Purse, such as are commonly made in Holland; one Five-Guinea Piece; two of Two Guineas each; one large Gold Medal; £4 10 s. in Half-Crown Pieces; three new Guineas; two Crown Pieces; and one Silver Medal the Size of a Spanish Dollar: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
